## 20 - User Patches Part 2 - Introduction

Summing Stacks can be saved as a new patch in your Logic Library. This means you can save a lot of different tracks inside the same patch, and load all of them with just one click.

Once these are saved, they are available for ever, and in a matter of seconds I can load a ton of tracks and be ready to compose.

To create a User patch, create the tracks you want to put inside the track stack. Then create a Summing Stack, instead of a Folder Stack. Continue by opening the Library and clicking on Save.

I can stack any kind of track and save it as a patch, wether these are Instrument tracks, audio tracks, or a combination of both.

If the Track Stack contains Instrument tracks you should save it under the Instrument menu of the suggested folder.

If the track Stack contains Audio tracks, Logic will suggest you to save it along with other Audio Patches. Audio Patches are used to save channel strip configurations for mixing purposes. It will not save regions or audio files.

If the track stack contains both audio and instrument tracks, Logic will suggest to save it under the Aux folder.

Where you save it is up to you.

I recommend you build a complete library of sounds for yourself, by creating your own User Patches, and never have to create tracks from scratch again.
